CONSTRUCTION UPDATE - WEEK OF JANUARY 18, 2016

Decatur Boulevard to Valley View Boulevard

Bus stop construction will leave two lanes open in the eastbound direction for approximately two weeks.

Koval Lane to Paradise Road

Bus stop construction will continue with three travel lanes open in each direction for approximately two weeks.

Paradise Road to Eastern Avenue

There will be various sidewalk closures for Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) ramp improvements for the next two weeks.

Flamingo Road and Eastern Avenue Intersection

Construction will continue requiring 24-hour lane restrictions on eastbound Flamingo and southbound Eastern for approximately one week.

Beginning Monday, Jan. 18, construction will require a 24-hour right-lane restriction on eastbound Flamingo and northbound Eastern for approximately one month.

Eastern Avenue to Sandhill Road

Electrical work will continue requiring intermittent temporary overnight traffic restrictions with intermittent right-lane closure from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. with all lanes back open to traffic during the daytime hours. These restrictions will be in place until February.

Bus Stop Impacts

Detours and temporary stops are in place for the following eastbound stops:

- 919-Flamingo and Arville
- 933-Flamingo and Decatur
- 930-Flamingo and Cameron
- 996-Flamingo and Valley View
- 1000-Flamingo and Royal Flush Way

Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) Tropicana Avenue Roadwork

NDOT has started work on Tropicana Avenue between Eastern Avenue and McLeod Drive. This work is taking place between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. and may include various lane restrictions. For further information on this work, please contact NDOT at (702) 385-6509.
