## CONSTRUCTION UPDATE - WEEK OF JANUARY 11, 2016

### Rainbow Boulevard to Decatur Boulevard

Median work will continue requiring 24-hour traffic restrictions. Two travel lanes will remain open in each direction for approximately one week.

### Koval Lane to Paradise Road

Bus stop construction will continue with a 24-hour eastbound right lane closure for two weeks. No Change from the week of Jan. 4

### Paradise Road to Eastern Avenue

Bus stop construction and electrical work will continue with nighttime traffic restrictions. Two travel lanes will remain open during night work between the hours of 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. From 6 a.m. to 9 p.m., two eastbound travel lanes will remain open, with no westbound restrictions during daytime hours.

Additionally, there will right lane closures from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. at the intersection of Flamingo and Palos Verdes for approximately one month.

### Flamingo Road and Eastern Avenue Intersection

Construction will continue requiring 24-hour lane restrictions. There will be a single right-lane closure on westbound Flamingo Road and southbound Eastern Avenue for approximately one month.

### Eastern Avenue to Sandhill Road

Electrical work will continue requiring intermittent temporary overnight traffic restrictions with a right lane closure from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. with all lanes back open to traffic during the daytime hours. These restrictions will be in place until February.

### Transit Route 202 Detours

Detours and temporary stops are in place for stops 933 (Flamingo and Decatur) and 930 (Flamingo and Cameron) for the duration of construction.

Transit riders should prepare for the possibility of late departures on Route 202 - Flamingo for the duration of the project.
