## Construction Update - Week of November 2, 2015

### Grand Canyon Drive to 215 Beltway

Paving work will begin on Nov. 1 requiring traffic restrictions from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Thursday Night and Saturday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. One travel lane will remain open in both directions during work hours for approximately one week.

### Fort Apache Road to Cimarron Road

Traffic signal work will begin on Nov. 1 requiring traffic restrictions from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. One travel lane will remain open in both directions for approximately three weeks.

### Rainbow Boulevard to Decatur Boulevard

Electrical work in both directions will continue to require 24-hour lane restrictions. Two lanes will remain open for westbound travel for approximately three weeks.

### Flamingo Road and Cameron Street

Sewer work will begin on Nov. 1 requiring traffic restrictions from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. One travel lane will remain open for eastbound travel for one month.

### Rainbow Boulevard to Hotel Rio Drive

Electrical work will continue during overnight hours. Various lane restrictions will be in place for approximately two months.

### Paradise Road to Eastern Avenue

Bus stop construction and electrical work will continue with both day and night traffic restrictions. Three travel lanes will remain open during day work with two travel lanes open during night work. This work will continue for approximately two months.

### Flamingo Road and Eastern Avenue Intersection

Construction will continue requiring 24-hour lane restrictions. There will be a single right-lane closure on westbound Flamingo and southbound Eastern Avenue for approximately three weeks.

### Transit Route 202 Detours

Transit riders should prepare for the possibility of late departures on Route 202 - Flamingo for the duration of the project.
