PROJECT FACT SHEET

Overview

The Pedestrian Comfort Study and Demonstration Projects will identify innovative strategies for the pedestrian environment in the Las Vegas Valley. The study will assess public perceptions of pedestrian comfort through surveys and focus groups, as well as a review of previous studies.

Case studies will be documented to show successful, innovative approaches to improving the pedestrian experience. The project will develop, implement, and evaluate several temporary, low-cost demonstration projects to allow the community to experience new designs and understand their potential success. A toolbox of design guidelines will be developed to increase comfort and safety and help encourage people to walk.
